secureNSW is the NSW Government's website that provides information about countering terrorism in New South Wales. Some of the website's information has been translated below.

Emergency and important phone numbers

It is important that you know the phone numbers you can call in relation to countering terrorism, and when you should call them. The calls to triple zero (000), the National Security Hotline and Crime Stoppers are all free call numbers from any phone in Australia, and they operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. If you do not speak English well, operators will organise a translator to join the line.

For the Police Assistance Line or to contact the Community Contact Unit - if you do not speak English well, you can call the Translating and Interpreting Service on 13 14 50 and ask them to contact them and interpret for you.

Emergency numbers

- **In an emergency call 000 (triple zero)**

Call 000 for urgent assistance from Police, Fire or Ambulance. This is a free call from any phone in Australia, disconnected mobile phone or a public phone.

Important numbers

- **National Security Hotline - 1800 1234 00**

If you are concerned that someone you know is being radicalised, or to report any suspicious activity or information related to terrorism, contact the National Security Hotline immediately on 1800 1234 00. All information is confidential and you can remain anonymous. You can also email the hotline on hotline@nationalecurity.gov.au

- **Crime Stoppers - 1800 333 000**

Call Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 to report crimes that are not in progress and/or have no known offender (e.g. break and enter, malicious damage, stealing, minor car accidents). Information can be given anonymously.

- **For general enquiries to police – 131 444**

If you are a victim or wish to report, or for general enquiries to police, unless it is an emergency, please contact the Police Assistance Line on 131 444.
